Funding Considerations

The costs to implement SafetyNet in a particular agency can vary based on agency size and structure, geographical responsibility, population and other considerations. SafetyNet has taken great care to keep the costs reasonable and affordable and to make it a program that will easily pay for itself following any successful search. SafetyNet is designed to save agencies time, manpower, money, and, most importantly, human lives.

- Due to the reasonable cost of the program and the benefits it provides, many agencies are able to utilize funding within their existing budgets to implement the program.
- Many agencies have applied for and received local, state and federal grants to pay for all costs associated with implementing SafetyNet in their communities as well as funding tracking devices for their citizens at risk who have financial need. Examples of successful grant applications include the Department of Justice (DOJ) Byrne Grants and Justice Assistance Grants (JAG).
- There are a growing number of agencies that once they made a public announcement that they were looking into SafetyNet to protect their citizens, various social organizations, businesses and individuals have stepped up and offered to provide the needed funding. Many large businesses and business chains have contributing to public safety efforts in their local community as part of their charters.
- SafetyNet can provide many suggestions to agencies regarding funding as well as copies of grant applications that have been successful in obtaining funding.
